Specific Details:

eapr MS. Very rare. No covers except for single leaf paper on front, nothing on back. Many leaves, especially in the outer quires, have been repaired. Usual helps for readers: chapter headings, lectionary abbreviations and $\alpha p \chi \eta$ and $\tau \epsilon \lambda o \zeta$, OT quotations marked with marginal arrow, etc. Evidence that the pages have been trimmed (see, e.g., 285a).

1–20: Lectionary abbreviations

20b: blank

21–22: replacement leaves, 2 columned, by a later scribe.

23a–28b: first hand, single columned 29a–30a: second hand, 2 columns

47–58: fragmentary leaves

70: replacement leaf, two columns.

71b-72a: κεφάλαια for Mark

72b: magnificent, multicolored icon of Mark, with text written *under* it that is coming through. Text reads, in part: οσα περι χριστοι οθεν γορος εθνεα πετρος ... This seems to be part of the liturgy that would be read in relation to the Gospel of Mark.

73a-104b: Mark

73a: ornate multi-colored headpiece for Mark

104a: Mark 16.8, then LE begins.

104b: subscriptio, στιχοι

105a-196b: κεφάλαια for Luke

106b: introduction to Luke

107a: blank

107b: detailed, multi-colored icon of Luke

108a-164a: Luke

108a: ornate multi-colored headpiece for Luke

164b: κεφάλαια for John—standard 18, no PA. Followed by brief biographical note.

165b: detailed, multi-colored icon of John with Prochoros in the cave of the Apocalypse

166a: two unprofessional (children's?) hands reproduce the opening lines of John's prologue—one in outer margin, one at bottom
