Trapezoid: larger on top than bottom; larger on the inside than outside.

207a (205a): *subscriptio* says: “written from Philippi through Stephanos and Phourounatos and Achaïos and Timothy”

207b (205b)–215b (213b): 2 Corinthians

¹ Because the scribe repeated Hebrews, which was already included earlier in GA 794, the second copying of Hebrews counts as a different MS. Thus, it is labeled as additional matter in GA 794.

² 57b has an icon of Luke which is painted over Mark 16.17–20. 57a goes through Mark 16.16, but only because the last four verses were inexplicably painted over by an artist. Another scribe added vv. 17–20 at the end of 57a.
