Specific Details:

Embossed leather over wood boards.

First inside front leaf, 1b, seems to be from LXX, 1 Kings 8.29 and environment, yet the rest is difficult to identify cursorily.

Second inside front leaf is unidentified.

MS has been in a fire. It appears as though the fire happened when the scribe was writing text on f. 185a [184a]: the text in the first column is not completed, and there is no second column or text on the verso. This leaf also has some of the worst fire damage of any leaf. The rest of the MS is finished in different hands. Does this suggest that the MS was not yet bound when the fire happened?

It is well used, consistently throughout. Perhaps, in light of its size, barely professional hand, and lack of ornamentation, it was used in divine service for a smaller monastery/church?

MS is somewhat trapezoid: larger on the inside than outside, but usually larger in the middle than either side.

93a [92a]: new hand

179b ff.: The hand changes several times from here to the end; sections are incomplete, there are lager erasures, and three pages (1.5 leaves) are single column.
