¹ The K-Liste measures the bifolio, even though calling the two bifolia four leaves. One purpose of such measurements is supposed to be to help identify if this MS is part of another MS. But measuring the bifolio does not accomplish that aim. Also, they have transposed the width and height numbers.

² As far as what is visible, there are 20–22 lines per page on the back bifolio. INTF's calculations are probably correct, however, since they would have determined the line count from the missing material. However, if so, their number should have been put in parentheses to indicate that it is not visible.

³ Two loose fragmentary leaves inside front cover one attached bifolio inside back cover.

⁴ The parentheses indicate that the leaves cannot be fully measured because they are used as binding material for a codex. These numbers are the accurate sizes of what is extant, but the actual size is definitely a little larger.

⁵ Number 82 is stamped on the inside front cover; it is crossed out and 78 is written.
